

Wrest Park Croquet Club – milestones and tournament winners 1961-2001

1961

Wrest Park Croquet Club is formed by employees of the National Institute for Agricultural Engineering (NIAE) and appears for the first time in the Croquet Gazette's list of clubs.

1962

During the winter of 1961-62 the club's first four sets of mild steel hoops are made by the members at a material cost of £4/6/1d.

1963

The club's constitution is written and approved. The NIAE administration agrees to the creation of four courts north of the Long Water.

1964

Wrest Park win the Longman Cup for the first time, beating Parsons Green 3-2 at Hurlingham in the final, the team consisting of Vic Rees (6), Anto Davies (7), Joe Clarke (7) and Tom Marchant (9).

The club buys some Jaques Eclipse balls at £6/10/6d per set.

1965

The club reach the final of the Longman Cup, losing to Roehampton.

1966

In April the club buy a 1936 Dennis mower (36 inch cut) for £72/10/6d. This gives 30 years service before being sold to the Hall and Duck Trust in 1998 for £100.

Wrest Park win the Longman Cup again, beating Roehampton 4-0. The team was V.Rees, Harry Green, T.Marchant, A.Davies.

Club members begin entering CA tournaments when A.Davies and John Wheeler play in the Cheltenham October weekend.

1967

Wrest Park starts to make its mark on the tournament scene when J.Wheeler wins two trophies at the Nottingham week and V.Rees and H.Green both win at the Challenge and Gilbey.

1971

The club win the Longman Cup for the third time, beating Hurlingham 3-1 in the final. The team was Anto Davies (3), Colin Cumming (4½), Trevor Wilkins and Norman Davren.

1972

Three more sets of mild steel hoops are made - the cost of materials is now £7.95, a doubling in price compared to the previous sets. Jaques Eclipse balls are now £10.95 per set, and a set of clips cost £2.60
